Risk Control Policy Statement

The safety and well being of the residents and employees of the Plattsburgh Housing Authority are of the utmost importance. It is also important for the Authority to safeguard its assets. Risk management procedures will be established and maintained to ensure the highest level of safety is provided for all.

It is the intention of the Authority to abide by applicable laws and regulations which govern the health and safety of the residents, employees, visitors, and property. Risk control techniques and methods will be employed where feasible to prevent and control losses which may threaten the health and well being of those the Authority serves.

Risk management and control is the responsibility of all levels of the Authority. Management and employees shall make all efforts feasible to ensure that the optimal level of safety is provided. Through the administration of the adopted *Risk Control Policy Statement* and the cooperation and support of those involved, the Authority will make risk control a priority.

SHOPPING CART REMINDERS...

DO NOT REMOVE CARTS FROM BUILDING



Be sure to return the carts to the lobby when you are finished using them. Do not leave the carts in the elevator or on your floor. Please be considerate of your neighbors. You needed the cart to get your belongings and packages to your apartment and so does your neighbor.

WINTER PARKING

During the winter months it is important that we keep the parking lots plowed. Please move your vehicle when requested to do so by PHA staff so that the plows can clean the parking spaces.

- If you go away during the winter for even a short period of time and leave your car in the parking lot, or are unable to personally move your car, please make arrangements for someone to move it for you. As part of your lease you are required to move your vehicle for snow removal and plowing. You will have 2 warnings and the 3rd time, your vehicle will be towed at your expense.
 - Each occasion you will receive a notice in your door or it will be on the security channel if Plattsburgh Housing needs vehicles moved to clear the parking lots. If your vehicle is not moved and Plattsburgh
- Housing employees need to knock on your door, it will be a warning. If this happens on 2 occasions, the 3rd time your vehicle will be towed. If you are unable to move you vehicle you must make arrangements with someone that can do so for you. If you vehicle is towed, it is at your own expense.

When cleaning the snow off your car, it would be helpful on your part to direct as much of the snow as possible toward outside the lot rather than into the parking spaces.
