BED BUGS & COCKROACHES... WHAT DO I DO?

If you see a bug....Call in a work order (518)563-0430 ext. 105. DO NOT TREAT THEM YOURSELF.

Where Do Bed Bugs Live?

- 1. Anywhere there are people
- 2. In furniture (sofa, chair, bed)
- 3. In household items (picture frames, clothing, curtains, etc...)

How do they travel?

- 1. "hitchhiking" on humans
- 2. "hitchhiking" in luggage
- 3. "hitchhiking" in purses
- 4. On stuffed animals
- 5. On/In household items (picture frames, beds, chairs, etc...)
- 6. Crawling under doors, in outlets and along plumbing fixtures

Bed bugs and cockroaches do not discriminate.Bed bugs gather:

- ✓ Where people sit or lay down for long period of time
- ✓ Where people set belongings down
- ✓ In places that have frequent travelers Cockroaches:
 - ✓ Live where there is food and water
 - ✓ Can be anywhere in the building.
 - ✓ Like cardboard
 - ✓ Are active at night (if they are seen during the day the infestation is serious)
 - Can aggravate allergies and asthma in people

Important Reminder:

****Items found discarded alongside the road, flea markets, yard sales and auctions are all areas in which you can pick up bed bugs and roaches. You do not know that the items are free from bugs or their offspring****

How can I minimize my risk of having a pest problem?

- Have a clean and sanitary apartment
- Trash must be disposed of properly and not left in the unit.
- Floors should be clean, clear, dry and free of hazards.
- Stove should be clean and free of food and grease.
- Refrigerator should be clean; freezer door should close properly.
- Cabinets should be clean and neat. Cabinet surfaces and counter tops should be free of grease and spilled food. Cabinets should not be overloaded. Storage under the sink should be limited to small or lightweight items to permit access for repairs. Heavy pots and pans should not be stored under the sink.
- Sink should be clean and free of grease and garbage. Dirty dishes should be washed and put away in a timely manner.
- Food storage areas should be neat and clean without spilled food.
- Trash and garbage should be stored in a covered container until removed to the disposal area.
- Linen closets and storage areas should be neat and clean.

The Resident will immediately notify the PHA of any damage or repair needed in the unit by calling in a work order to the Maintenance Department. The Resident further agrees not to make any repairs or changes to the premises without prior written approval from the PHA.
