## **What to bring to your appointment:**

- Picture ID** for you and your spouse if married and filing jointly (NYS Driver's License or State ID)
- Social Security Cards** and **Birth Dates** for you, your spouse, and dependents
- W-2 Forms** for all jobs held in 2017; Information for all other income
- Forms 1099** (1099R, 1099G, 1099Misc, 1099Int, 1099C, 1099DIV, etc), Broker Statements
- Forms 1095-A, B or C (Affordable Health Care Statements)
- A copy of last year's tax return (**THIS IS A MUST**)
- Proof of bank account for direct deposit and faster refund (bank routing number and account number)
- Your spouse, if married filing jointly

## **OTHER RECEIPTS** that *may increase* your tax refund:

- Rental information for NYS credit (only if total household income is less than \$18,000)
- Total paid to day care provider and their tax ID number (provider name, address, and amount paid)
- Education expenses for you, your spouse, or dependent who attended college (1098T, Tuition Expense Statement, and/or 1098E, Student Loan Interest Statement)
- School and Property taxes, Mortgage Interest, unreimbursed Medical Expenses, Charitable Contributions
- If you purchased a car during 2017, bring the sales tax information

## **Frequently Asked Questions:**

**Volunteer tax assistance**-Why use it? As a service to the community, it helps working families get the money and assistance they've earned by providing free income tax preparation and E-filing for those who may be less able to afford a paid tax preparer.

**Program eligibility**-Can I use the service? While most returns can be done, including NY and VT non-resident, some may be more complex and need referral to a more specialized preparer.

**EITC**-What is it? The Earned Income Tax Credit is a refundable income tax credit that is available to low-income workers with "earned" income, wages or self-employment income. If your family earnings are less than \$53,930, you may qualify for a federal credit up to \$6,381, plus an additional NYS credit. If you qualify, you could reduce or eliminate your income tax, even get money back that could be used for savings, home repairs, or other expenses.

**Child and Dependent Care Credit**-What is it? If you work and need to pay for child care, you may be eligible for federal and state credits.

**Refund Anticipation Loans (RALs)**-Are they a good idea? RALS, which borrow against your own refund, are extremely expensive. Loan fees typically range from \$30-\$90 which would equal an annual Percentage rate (APR) of about 60% to over 700%. RALS can eat away a big chunk of your tax refund.

**Savings at tax time**-Why do it? It is quick and easy to save part of your tax refund, directly depositing into as many as three accounts, including the purchase of US Savings Bonds. Pay yourself first by putting some in a savings account, and then use the rest to pay your bills or make a purchase through your checking account.
